From the onset, this term's focus was on racing, building on the success at Fairbairn's. M1 competed in seven races in just eight weeks of training. Following a productive pre-Lent training camp, M1 kicked things off with Winter League; racing this early was invaluable for building confidence and developing the vital team spirit necessary to be successful. Next, they placed 4th out of 11 at the Winter Head-to-Head and were just 18 seconds behind the winner of Newnham Head. For the first off-Cam race in Bedford, M1 raced twice, cinching 2nd and 3rd place. Unfortunately, the odds were not in their favour during the Pembroke Regatta, and they weren't able to win against a strong Downing team. Combined with intense training, these racing opportunities shaped the team and supported Bumps preparation.

As a sandwich boat between the first and second division, M1 had a daunting undertaking ahead of them. Day one saw M1 hold off Selwyn M1 by rowing over in the second division. This early victory helped buoy the team for the remainder of the campaign, as they earned an opportunity to row in the top division and upheld their annual tradition of holding off Selwyn! Unfortunately, in the first division on day 2, M1 was not able to bump Christ's, resulting in another day as a sandwich boat.

Day 3 presented a dual challenge: the formidable task of holding off Selwyn in division 2 again and bumping Christ's in the subsequent division 1 race, all while battling the elements including snow and torrential rain.

The severity of the previous day's weather provided an unexpected day off, due to hazardous river conditions. The final day of Bumps was, admittedly, anti-climactic as M1 was bumped by a strong Caius M2 team.
